which is the absolute paradox, veritably exists. This is the theme of the Gospel..."

The fact that we creatures are in any kind of relation with our Creator punches a hole in the fabric of skepticism, but this goes beyond that by proclaiming that it is a positive relation - the absolute paradox, as Barth said, that sinful creatures and Holy God are in a positive relation. At the time of Jesus' birth this was the essence of the message of the angel delivered to the shepherds that holy night when they were out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. *And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying, "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom he is pleased!"*

Karl Barth, arguably the most influential academic theologian of the 20th century, once wrote these words: "The positive relation between God and man,

The remarkable words of the heavenly multitude would have no meaning if Christ hadn't died on a cross and then risen from the dead. But he did, because "God so loved the world..." *And you, who once were estranged... Christ has now reconciled in his body of flesh by his death, in order to present you holy and blameless and irreproachable before God (Colossians 1:21-22).*

The amazing thing is that God's love and our positive relationship with him are not based on our character but God's character. The "American work ethic" is built on hard work, accomplishment, and "earning it the old-fashioned way." We are constantly trying to earn the respect and admiration of others. But our positive relationship with God, the absolute paradox, is not a matter of trying, but trusting. *All who received him (Christ), who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God (John 1:12).*

I am a child of God? Talk about the absolute paradox! May God grant us all peace in believing this New Year and always.
