I am grateful for the opportunity that stewardship season provides to reflect upon my relationship with money and to repent. In doing so, I am reminded that God's grace is always sufficient, and that "He who did not spare his own Son but gave him up for us all, how will he not also with him graciously give us all things?" (Romans 8:32). My prayer this season is that I would really believe this, and as a result, I would let go of the things of this world and instead "seek first the kingdom of God and his righteousness" (Matthew 6:33).
