



Dear Parish Family:

As I invite your prayerful consideration of our annual stewardship campaign, I begin with a word of thanks. God is generous and faithful. The Advent has a clear, consistent gospel message that sustains and directs all we do in addressing the needs, opportunities, and challenges in our call to serve. We seek to increase the number of those to whom we offer the life-giving word of grace.

All of our ministry begins and ends with the message of God's gracious, unmerited, extravagant love for sinners: "But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). This word is rephrased, presented in different images and contexts, but never changing. This true, life-giving, reconciling word of Jesus is at the center of all we do in our worship, education, care, and service.

It is also in the ministry to the men and women of our church, and the opportunities given to all of us to serve and engage.

Care for one another sets up and flows into our care for the community. We are actively seeking ways for you to give that which you have received and to experience in giving the abundant life Jesus promised. We continue to be engaged globally, but are increasingly led to find new ways to engage and seek the well-being of our city. There is pressing need around us, and God is making clear his call for us to engage our neighbors.

We are in a great moment, gifted with numerous signs of encouragement and call, and your partnership is critical. We cannot continue the Advent's ministry without the pledges of our congregation. We are dependent upon them, God's provision for our ministries comes through you. If you have not pledged previously, I pray that you will consider pledging this year. If you have, thank you, and I join you as you prayerfully consider your pledge for the coming year. I am praying for us all as we engage this together.
