A Word from the Dean



"Lord, to whom shall we go?" (John 6:68) What Jesus said was shocking and offensive: unless you eat my flesh and drink my blood, you have no part of me. Even spoken figu-

ratively, the statement changed the dynamic of the relationship, and a decision is before those gathered.

In response to the departure of many, Jesus asks his disciples if they take offense and would like to leave. Peter's response? "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life, and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God" (John 6:68-69).

Faith, love, and discipleship are always in the context of human limitation. Relationships, even the best of them, reveal our limitations and invite our dependence upon something beyond ourselves, upon God.

In A River Runs Through It, in the context of fly-fishing and the Blackfoot River, Norman Maclean is writing about his brother, his family, and the human condition. His

beloved brother, Paul, has died. Paul, beautiful but perplexing and headstrong from birth to death, was always just beyond the reach of his family, and in his death they are left with questions. Into these questions Norman writes these words:

"Each one of us here today will at one time in our lives look upon a loved one who is in need and ask the same question: We are willing to help, Lord, but what, if anything, is needed? For it is true we can seldom help those closest to us. Either we don't know what part of ourselves to give or, more often than not, the part we have to give is not wanted. And so it is those we live with and should know who elude us. But we can still love them – we can love completely without complete understanding."

Jesus is the one thing needful. Peter's and Norman's responses reveal the good news of what it means to follow and live in Jesus. Love and discipleship are not a test of retention of information, having the answers to all questions. It is loving and leaning upon because he first loved us.

On Friday evening, November 10, he will be at Red Mountain Theater (1600 Third Avenue South 35233). We will begin to gather in the lobby for desserts and a cash



bar at 7:00 p.m. At 7:45, Chad will begin speaking on "Messy Discipleship: Deceitful Jacob as God's Unlikely Man." We will be finished by 9:00 p.m.

On Saturday morning, November 11, he will be in our Refectory. Chad will begin at 9:00 a.m., speaking first on "Wrestling with God and Limping Onward with a Blessing." After a break, he will continue with a second talk on Saturday morning: "The Prodigal Reunion and Growing Old by the Pyramids." We will be finished no later than 11:30 a.m.

On Sunday morning, November 12, Chad will lead the Dean's Class, which starts at 10:15 (again in the Refectory). Chad will be working from the Psalms that morning, with the title "Untamed Prayers."

Charles Kennedy to Perform Harpsichord Recital

Our own Charles Kennedy will present a free, 30-minute recital on the Advent's French double harpsichord on Friday, November 17, 12:30 p.m. in the Nave. This Midday Music concert will feature a program of music by English composer William Byrd, in commemoration of the 400th anniversary of Byrd's death, following up on a similar program performed in the Midday series this past February. Byrd was the most famous composer of his generation, noted especially for his keyboard works and sacred choral music, much of the latter written for use in the Anglican service. Please do not miss the opportunity to hear extraordinary music performed on our beautiful harpsichord!


