A Word from Canon Young



Happy Thanksgiving! Not merely in the Hallmark way of sending greetings, but in the honest reminder that we all have much for which we are grateful. No matter our present

circumstance or station in life, the givenness of things means we are all recipients of and participants in a life we neither created nor sustained individually. God's grace has been and always remains foundational to our existence and experience. Yet, I find gratitude a difficult thing to practice. Yesterday's goodness often gets replaced by today's anxiety and tomorrow's pressure. I am so forgetful when it comes to ways and times that I had enough and was cared for. My persistent cravings for comfort leave me often singing with Mick Jagger, "I can't get no satisfaction."

A pervasive pattern in the Old Testament consists of warning God's people not to forget what the Lord their God has done for them. "Remember the Lord your God, who brought you out of slavery in Egypt" appears again and again. I need a reminder that my life is not my own because I was bought with a price. A reminder that in spite of my best efforts (as well as my failed ones), all that I have and all that I am is due to the grace, mercy, and benevolence of the God who loves me.

The Collect for Thanksgiving Day in our Prayer Book says it more beautifully and truly than I can:

"Almighty and gracious Father, we give thee thanks for the fruits of the earth in their season and for the labors of those who harvest them. Make us, we beseech thee, faithful stewards of thy great bounty, for the provision of our necessities and the relief of all who are in need, to the glory of thy Name; through Jesus Christ our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. Amen."


