## A Word from the Vice Dean

One of our favorite family holiday traditions is watching the movie *Christmas Vacation*, a comedy from the 1980s starring Chevy Chase. Along with the humorous

character development, I think one of the reasons we love it so is because it paints such an honest picture of what the holidays are really like – complicated family dynamics and plans going awry. It's refreshing, especially amid the cultural pressures we all face to present as though everything is going perfectly well, when in truth it really isn't. Like the bumper sticker says, "May your life someday be as awesome as you pretend it is on social media."

The truth is, below the surface, beneath the outward appearances, most of us are struggling with something. And because of that, many are wondering this time of year if all this talk about Christmas hope and joy, and the peace of God which passes understanding... can all of that really be a reality for them this year? The prophet Isaiah reminds us that the people of God have always asked that question, and that God responded with the promise of a coming Savior, a Messiah. "The people who walked in darkness have seen a great light; those who lived in a land of deep darkness, on them light has shined" (Isaiah 9:2).

If everyone in your family is doing well right now, and life is currently all you could hope it to be – then praise God! But if you are one who approaches the manger this year with pain in your heart, know this: the Good News of Christmas is that the messianic promise of God is fulfilled. "For to us a child is born, to us a son is given."

As my favorite Christmas card says, "He came to pay a debt he didn't owe because we owed a debt we couldn't pay." Thus, Christmas is merely the first step on the journey that ultimately leads to the cross and empty grave, because that is where sin and death were ultimately defeated by God, through the One born that first Christmas Day – Jesus Christ our Lord.


