## A Word from Canon Young



The late, great Tom Petty sang "The waiting is the hardest part." Waiting really is difficult, which I suspect is why the Lord graciously gave us the season known as Advent. It gives voice to the feeling of anticipation of what is to come. All of December buzzes with the youthful excitement of the build-up to presents and Santa and all the festivity of Christmas. Yet waiting also characterizes life's expectation of change. Getting called to the counter at the DMV. Awaiting the letter of acceptance or rejection to a college or job. Waiting even captures the dreadful heaviness of wanting to finally know some significant outcome. The text from a loved one that they arrived safely at their destination. The call from the oncologist with biopsy results.

Advent captures the core experience of our Christian hope: waiting - waiting for relief, for rescue, for a breakthrough. Recalling the first Advent of Christ in the man-
ger and longing for the second Advent of Christ's return, bringing a new heaven and a new earth, Dietrich Bonhoeffer, the German pastor martyred under Hitler's Nazi regime, wrote that Advent is like "a prison cell, in which one waits, hopes - and is completely dependent on the fact that the door of freedom has to be opened from the outside." He wrote these palpable words from a jail cell awaiting the gas chamber. While our circumstances are not quite so stark, our location is not altogether fundamentally different from Bonhoeffer's. Shackled in a world of sin and death, we eagerly await full and final deliverance from the God who overcame the grave.

This Advent, join me in anticipating God making all things new through the Word Made Flesh, Jesus Christ. Join the Ionely and the weary and the desperate and the broken in our common prayer for "Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven." God promises to bring deliverance. "If it seems slow, wait for it; it will surely come, it will not delay" (Habakkuk 2:3a). Amen. Come quickly, Lord Jesus.
