A Word from Canon Gardner

One of the great benefits of serving as Advent Episcopal School Chaplain is having a "front-row seat" to the school's service of Lessons and Carols. This is now my second year

of having witnessed this rich tradition. And as always, each reading and carol communicated powerfully the saving purposes of God. But the one carol that struck me most this year was the piece "Mary's Lullaby" by Gale Richard Price. When I first heard this carol at the dress rehearsal, I was caught off guard as to how deeply it would touch me. Thank God there was a box of Kleenex nearby, because I could not stop the stream of tears pouring from my eyes!

Maybe this strong emotional response was in part due to the lovely voices of the children singing it. And maybe too it had something to do with having our infant son in the world now. Both of these circumstances certainly played a part. But I believe the theological message proclaimed in the piece is what ultimately touched me. Mary

is singing this lullaby to the newborn Jesus, repeatedly saying in the refrain "Sleep well, my child; sleep well my tiny babe." In the third stanza she attests, "Your hands will bring healing, your hands will make us whole; your eyes will show compassion, your body a cruel death will know." Cue the water works. This wrecked me. How can a mother face knowing the fate for this child?

God subjected himself to such vulnerability in the Incarnation: the vulnerability of being human, of being an infant, and ultimately of death. Who can fathom this? Who can fathom the words from the prologue of John's Gospel?: "The Word became flesh and dwelt among us." And the Word did not choose comfort: no the Word chose the humble cradle and the cruel cross. God meets us in the most vulnerable places in order to make us whole. This Christmas I do pray that God meets you with tidings of comfort and joy. And perhaps you will find him where you need him most: in those vulnerable places of your life that need healing and wholeness.


