A Word from the Dean

Perhaps among the heaviest weights is the weight of expectation. A sibling of expectation is comparison, and athletics is one of their many playgrounds. One of the ongoing NBA

storylines is judging the progression of Zion Williamson compared to Victor Wemban-yama. For context, both were selected number one in the NBA draft a few years apart, Williamson by the New Orleans Pelicans and Wembanyama by the San Antonio Spurs. Immediately the unfettered hopes and weight of expectations were placed upon these young men, not only from the franchises, their communities, and fan bases, but also from the NBA machine.

Williamson has struggled to stay healthy and maintain his weight, and Wemban-yama, despite being seven-foot-four (!) with point-guard skills, has struggled to acclimate. Combine this with the fact that their vast salaries engender resentment and increase expectation, many are ready to pounce on their failures or struggles. You

have two people, as David Bowie would sing, "under pressure."

We too know pressure, the weight of expectations, the tyranny of comparisons. In response to the critique of Williamson, one of his teammates, Jose Alvarado, recently came to his defense: "They're trying to push him to be great. Obviously, we appreciate that. But forget all that (negativity) towards him. He's a human being. If that was me, I don't know how I would respond. ... I don't know how he could do it at that age. He handles it very well. I crash out when I have bad games, and I'm not even a star. I'm a role player and I go in there and lose my mind. He stays professional. He accepts all the criticism. He's a good dude. He's a person that's growing, and we've got his back."

What a great word from a teammate, a rare word of perspective, a word of grace. Would you like to hear that someone appreciates your struggles, your humanity, has your back? That is a Christmas word. Not a word that pounces on our failures, but a word of saving grace and love: the news of a Savior, that God has our back.


