Recently we had pubbegin to dou baptisms at the Adent. I had the pleasure I was just g

lic baptisms at the Advent. I had the pleasure of hearing two fantastic sermons that morning: one from Tom Murray and one from Will Fagan. I commend

both of them to you. It was a great Sunday. But the greatest part for me personally was having the privilege of baptizing my youngest child.

Not one of my children will consciously remember their baptism, because babies do not remember such things. As for me, I was baptized at the age of 14. But despite being baptized later in life, I cannot remember my baptism all that well either. It is certainly a blurry memory at best. I do remember wearing a robe and holding my breath as I went under water, but I do not remember my emotions or thoughts. And that is a comfort to me. If I try to reconstruct my emotions or thoughts, then I can

begin to doubt, saying "What if my heart was not really in the right place? What if I was just going through the motions?" These simply are not the right questions to ask. The point is that I was baptized.

A Word from Canon Gardner

At any given moment in this Christian life, we can doubt our own thoughts, responses, or behaviors. Inevitably this leads us down a dark path of trying to find faith or righteousness in ourselves. We will not find it there. Faith is a gift from the Holy Spirit and righteousness belongs to us only through the death and resurrection of Jesus. We look not to ourselves, but to the God who has spoken emphatically to us through his beloved Son. Baptism is simply a "visible word," as Robert Jenson called it, reminding us that we have been claimed by a gracious God in the person and work of Jesus.

The Advent is honored to welcome James O'Donnell, LVO, for our morning choral services on February 11, the Last Sunday after the Epiphany. He will conduct the Cathedral Choir at Holy Communion at 9:00 a.m., and at Choral Matins, a special service of Morning Prayer, at 11:00 a.m.

One of the most celebrated concert organists, choral conductors, and liturgical musicians of our time, James O'Donnell served for more than two decades as Organist and Master of the Choristers at Westminster Abbey. He currently serves as Professor in the Practice of Organ at the Yale School of Music and Institute of Sacred Music. We hope you will make plans to attend and welcome Mr. O'Donnell to the Advent.


