A Word from the Vice Dean



Love is one of those words so often used that it can be a good exercise to occasionally reflect upon what we mean when we use it. For example, "I love my family" certainly means

something different than "I love mint chocolate chip ice cream." To make things even more complicated, the way our culture typically portrays love between individuals can be altogether different from the kind of love we find revealed in Scripture.

The first thing to note about biblical love is that Jesus had to command it (John 15:17). Because our culture leans toward love as a feeling (sadly, a feeling we get when we get something we want), the idea of needing to command love hardly makes sense. But love is experienced and expressed as both feeling and behavior, isn't it, and there is a relationship between the two.

In fact, I often tell couples in premarital conversations that, in the same way affectionate feelings can lead to loving behaviors, so can loving behaviors lead to affectionate feelings. Sadly, for many, the behaviors are dependent upon the feelings. In other words, some may tell you that they received more flowers and kind notes when they were dating than they have since getting married!

Interestingly, when we begin with love as a decision to behave in a loving way, affectionate feelings are almost certain to follow. I believe this is in part why so many more marriages from a couple of generations ago stood the test of time. Love was more clearly understood as a behavior, a decision, and at times even a sacrifice.

The greatest love the world has ever known is revealed on the hard wood of Jesus' cross. It wasn't an affectionate feeling that prompted Jesus to say, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." The cross was painful. It was "while we were yet sinners that Christ died for us" (Romans 5:8). And what does that kind of love draw forth from us? Affectionate feeling. "We love, because he first loved us" (1John 4:19). It's a biblically proven way to experience more love in our lives, to begin with love as behavior.
