A Word from the Vice Dean

I'd like to express my sincere gratitude to those who have reached out in recent days to express their condolences. The love support and from many of you has deep-

ened my already strong appreciation for this church family. My mother's death is something I continue to process, and I've felt led to share some of my reflections with you.

My father died on Ash Wednesday two years ago, and it was an extraordinary thing to process when I received the phone call with that news. His health had been in sharp decline, and I had therefore just traveled from Florida to North Carolina to be with him. Once back in Florida, the phone call came as I was leaving church after our evening Ash Wednesday service. Although expected, it was still a shock. And then it suddenly occurred to me that, as my Dad was transitioning from this reality to glory, I was administering ashes with the words, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return."

Fast forward a couple of years... I re-

cently traveled to North Carolina to visit my mother, whose health had been in sharp decline. The timing was such that I was able to spend a few days with family before traveling back to Birmingham to be here for Ash Wednesday. The thought had crossed my mind, "Wouldn't it be something if Mom also went on Ash Wednesday," but it didn't appear as though she would go that quickly, and the thought therefore left about as quickly as it came. But, sure enough, shortly after I got home after our evening Ash Wednesday service, the call came. I instantly thought, "Wow, what are the odds of that," but immediately after thought, "Lord, you're so amazing."

I'm still processing it all, but the recurring realization is that the "fingerprints of God" are everywhere when we are "tuned in" to perceive them. Sometimes they are simply unmistakable, other times far more subtle, but either way they bring enormous reassurance that the Lord is near. My prayer for all of us as we continue our Lenten journey is that we would have the eyes of our hearts enlightened, that we may know what is the hope to which he has called us.

Aaron Zimmerman has served as Rector of St. Alban's Episcopal Church in Waco, Texas, since 2013. His childhood took him to several cities around the world before he settled in Winston-Salem, North Carolina. After graduating from Harvard University, he spent two years teaching with an educational non-profit in Kazakhstan, and later worked at the Harvard Business School and H.J. Heinz.



Mr. Zimmerman graduated from Trinity School for Ministry in 2008, and served churches in Pittsburgh and Houston before his call to St. Alban's. He is a contributor to the Mockingbird blog and magazine, and co-hosts *Same Old Song*, the weekly lectionary podcast of Mockingbird Ministries. He and his wife Andrea have three children.

Bus to Run to Lenten Preaching and Lunches March 11 and 21



Beeson's Robert Smith to Preach Friday

Robert Smith is Professor of Christian Preaching at Beeson Divinity School in Birmingham, Alabama, where he holds the Charles T. Carter Baptist Chair of Divinity. He served as Pastor of New Mission Missionary Baptist Church in Cincinnati, Ohio, for 20 years. He taught at The Southern Baptist Theological Seminary before his call to Beeson. He has won teaching awards at both schools, and he is the 2017 E.K. Bailey Expository Preaching Conference Living Legend.



A veteran of our Lenten series, Dr. Smith has spoken and taught at schools and churches around the world. He has authored several books, including the award-winning Doctrine That Dances: Bringing Doctrinal Preaching and Teaching to Life. In 2010, Preaching magazine named Doctrine That Dances one of the 25 most influential books in preaching in the last 25 years. His research interests include the place of passion in preaching and the literary history of African-American preaching. He and his wife Wanda are the parents of four adult children.


