A Word from Canon Gardner On a gorgeous, sun-

ny afternoon this Lent, I was afforded about 20 minutes to sit in the Rector's Garden here at the church. I rarely take time like this just to sit. A dear friend

here at the church encouraged me to go enjoy God's creation. I did. The weather was perfect: not cold and not hot, just right. Goldilocks would have loved it. The breeze was gentle, and the newly budding plants danced a bit for me as the sunlight crept through the branches of the trees. I'm grateful for moments like these.

But inevitably what captured my attention in the garden were the names etched in stone of many loved ones who have gone before us to meet the Lord. Many of these names I have known over the years, and many I have not. What struck me though was the beauty of the garden, with spring and fresh life just around the corner, juxtaposed with the names of our faithful

departed. There are signs of life and signs of death in the same space.

And this is true of all of our life and existence. We are surrounded by life and death all at the same time. Simone de Beauvoir stated that "From the hour you are born vou begin to die" - a sobering thought indeed. And if this life is all there is, then this is a pitiful and sad existence. All would be vain. If the Resurrection of Christ is not true, then "we are of all people most to be pitied. But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead" (1 Corinthians 15:19-20). This Holy Week we remember and celebrate the death, burial, and resurrection of our Lord. This gives us confidence and assurance that this life is not in vain. This life is precious in the sight of the Lord, and death has not the final word. Forgiveness, life, love, and everlasting peace are the budding fruits of Christ's labor. May they blossom in our midst.

Josh Chatraw to Preach Monday

Josh Chatraw was appointed the Billy Graham Chair for Evangelism and Cultural Engagement at Beeson Divinity School in Birmingham, Alabama, in 2023. His research, writing, and speaking focuses on public theology, apologetics, evangelism, and culture. Before his call to Beeson, he served in several positions in Raleigh, North Carolina, including Theologian-in-Residence at Holy Trinity Anglican Church. Dr. Chatraw has



also taught at Liberty University and served as a pastor at Baptist churches in Virginia and Georgia.

An award-winning writer, he has written or contributed to eight books, including *Telling a Better Story* and *Cultural Engagement*, and is an inaugural fellow at The Timothy Keller Center for Cultural Apologetics. He and his wife Tracy have two children.

Gordon Bals Is Our Noonday Preacher Tuesday

Gordon Bals is Associate Professor of Pastoral Care and Counseling at Beeson Divinity School in Birmingham, Alabama. He teaches courses in pastoral care and counseling, marriage and family counseling, and sexuality and pastoral care. A boardcertified pastoral counselor, he started Daymark Pastoral Counseling in 1997. He previously worked as an adolescent and family counselor and Assistant Pastor at Shados Valley Community Course in Pirming



Shades Valley Community Church in Birmingham.

In addition to his counseling, Dr. Bals leads training workshops for pastors and congregational leaders. He has written two books, including *Grace From Head to Heart: Experiencing God's Kindness in a Fallen World*. He is married to Dawn, and they have three daughters.

Doug Sweeney in the Pulpit Wednesday


Doug Sweeney became the second Dean of Beeson Divinity School in Birmingham, Alabama, in 2019. In this role he shepherds the institution by providing strategic leadership and facilitating its work to prepare men and women for gospel ministry. Before coming to Beeson, he taught at schools including Yale Divinity School, Trinity Evangelical Divinity School, and the University of Heidelberg. An evangelical Lutheran, he is affiliated with Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ.



Dr. Sweeney is the author or editor of more than 20 books on the history of Christian doctrine, American church history, and other topics. His latest book is *The Substance of Our Faith: Foundations for the History of Christian Doctrine*, the first of two volumes on the global history of doctrine. He and his wife Wilma have one adult son.

James Spann to Preach Thursday

James Spann has been Chief Meteorologist for ABC 33/40 in Birmingham, Alabama, for 25 years. In all, he has been a television weather anchor for 44 years, having also worked in Tuscaloosa, Montgomery, and Dallas, Texas. He has received the two highest awards in the nation for a broadcast meteorologist. One is *Broadcaster of the Year* by the National Weather Association. He also was awarded the American Meteorological



Society's Award for Broadcast Meteorology. He has won multiple Emmy awards over the years.

Mr. Spann has served in children's ministry for years, and every Sunday he leads Children's Worship at Double Oak Community Church in Mount Laurel. He is married to Karen, and they have two sons.


